



#### FROM THE DIRECTOR



When I was five my aunt took me to see Jaws at the movie theatre while vacationing at the beach. It was one of the first films I ever saw and it made an impression. I still can't enjoy being in the ocean although I love being at the beach. That constant question of what may be lurking below the surface stays with me.

This being the 50th Anniversary of the release of Jaws, it seemed the perfect time to bring *The Shark* 

is Broken to our stage.

The off camera tension between Robert Shaw and Richard Dreyfuss has been well documented despite Dreyfuss' more recent denial that the feud never happened. Ian Shaw, son of Robert Shaw, co-wrote this play, (and appeared as his father in the Broadway production) using interview footage and his father's recollections of the notorious differences between the two actors. When asked in an interview how he handled working with actors who he didn't like, Shaw said that he treated them like they were his children. This is evident as the actors switch between camaraderie and conflict with Roy Scheider often playing the peacemaker. It's a delicious peek behind the curtain of the iconic film that has stood the test of time.





Kevin spent 20 years touring the country with "Capitol Steps", performing song parodies, political satire, and stand-up. After the pandemic forced the demise of the Steps, Kevin began performing & writing for "Capitol Fools", reuniting with former Steps colleagues to create a new version of the old format. Kevin teaches improvisation at Round House Theatre and is the director of RHT's teen comedy ensemble, "The Roundlings". He is also a faculty member at The National Conservatory


